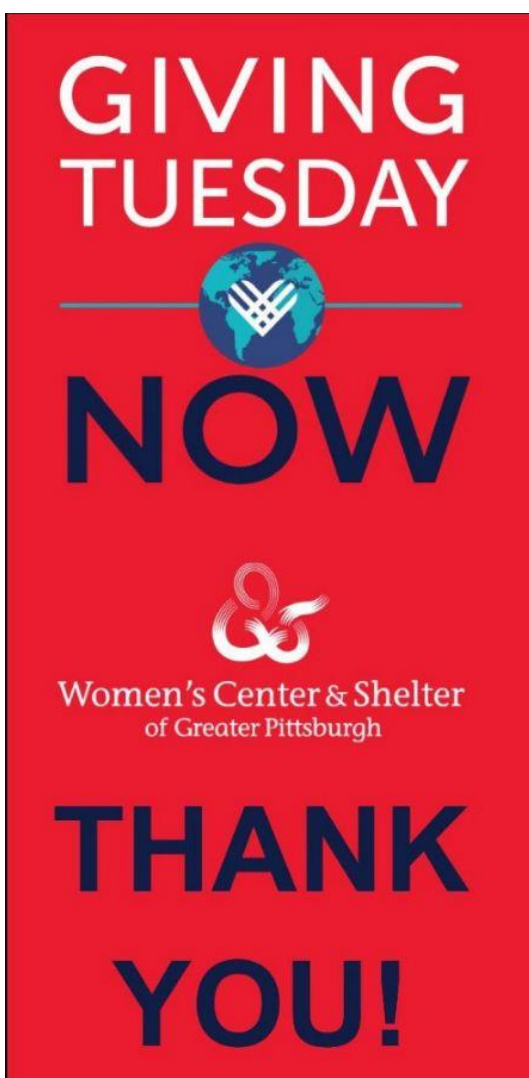


Dear Friends,

To address the new barriers the pandemic has created for IPV survivors seeking help, **Giant Eagle has teamed up with Women's Center & Shelter, Crisis Center North and the Alle-Kiski Area HOPE Center** to reach survivors during stay-at-home orders. Beginning this week, [postcards](#) (.pdf) with contact information for all three centers have been placed in 42 Giant Eagle locations in Allegheny County. Postcards are available at the end of every register in each store, totaling more than 12,600 postcards. The postcards offer a variety of options for IPV survivors to be in contact, when safe – and many times the critical opportunity is when those affected are out of the home. **THANK YOU** to Giant Eagle for being such an incredible community partner!

Introducing our NEW Text and Chat Features

With IPV on the rise and stay-at-home orders still in place, it has become more necessary than ever to add new ways in which survivors can reach out for help. To address this growing need, Women's Center & Shelter has debuted two new ways to reach out for help; a text line and an online chat feature. These outreach options are in addition to our existing [24-Hour Hotline](#) which will operate as usual.

If someone is not able to talk on the phone, they can now:

- **Text the number (240) 249-7867** and a WC&S Advocate will be standing by to assist.
- **Access the online chat** by visiting the [WC&S website](#), and **clicking on the Chat for Help pop-up button.**
